"This is life eternal," He said, "that they might know Thee the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom Thou hast sent." John 17:3.



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# God's Ways to Wellness

## - Part 3

A fourth way that God deals with illness is to allow us to die.

### Lazarus

"Now a certain man was sick, named Lazarus, When Jesus heard that, he said, This sickness is not unto death, but for the glory of God, that the Son of God might be glorified thereby. When he had heard therefore that he was sick, he abode two days still in the same place where he was. Howbeit Jesus spake of his death: but they thought that he had spoken of taking of rest in sleep. Then said Jesus unto them plainly, Lazarus is dead." John 11:1, 4,6,13,14

In this story, we see Jesus allowing Lazarus to die. Now to his family this was the worst possible thing, and they could not understand why Jesus would suffer this to happen; but in the end we see it was "for the glory of God, that the Son of God might be glorified thereby." As we are often reminded when someone dies, God knows best, and for whatever reason, He has allowed this to happen.

### Hezekiah

The second story is found back in 2 Kings 20:1-5

"In those days was Hezekiah sick unto death. And the prophet Isaiah the son of Amoz came to him, and said unto him, Thus saith the LORD, Set thine house in order; for thou shalt die, and not live. Then he turned his face to the wall, and prayed unto the LORD . . . And it came to pass, afore Isaiah was gone out into the middle court, that the word of the LORD came to him, saying, Turn again, and tell Hezekiah the captain of my people, Thus saith the LORD, the God of David thy father, I have heard thy prayer, I have seen thy tears: behold, I will heal thee: on the third day thou shalt go up unto the house of the LORD."

You remember the story, and it does have a good application; but there is another side of this

story as well. The following article gives some insights on this story.

Speaking of the Babylonian king it says:

"Their king, Merodach-baladan, upon learning that this miracle had been wrought as a sign to the king of Judah that the God of heaven had granted him a new lease of life, sent ambassadors to Hezekiah to congratulate him on his recovery, and to learn, if possible, more of the God who was able to perform so great a wonder.

"The visit of these messengers from the ruler of a far-away land gave Hezekiah an opportunity to extol the living God. How easy it would have been for him to tell them of God, the upholder of all created things, through whose favor his own life had been spared when all other hope had fled! What momentous transformations might have taken place had these seekers after truth from the plains of Chaldea been led to acknowledge the supreme sovereignty of the living God.

"But pride and vanity took possession of Hezekiah's heart, and in self-exaltation he laid open to covetous eyes the treasures with which God had enriched his people. The king 'showed them the house of his precious things, the silver, and the gold, and the spices, and the precious ointment, and all the house of his armor, and all that was found in his treasures: there was nothing in his house, nor in all his dominion, that Hezekiah showed them not.' Isaiah 39:2. Not to glorify God did he do this, but to exalt himself in the eyes of the foreign princes. He did not stop to consider that these men were representatives of a powerful nation that had not the fear nor the love of God in their hearts, and that it was imprudent to make them his confidants concerning the temporal riches of the nation.

". . . Had Hezekiah improved the opportunity given him to bear witness to the power, the goodness, the compassion, of the God of Israel, the report of the ambassadors would have been as light piercing darkness. But he magnified himself above the Lord of hosts. He 'rendered not again according to the benefit done unto him; for his heart was lifted up.'

"Disastrous were the results which were to follow. To Isaiah it was revealed that the

returning ambassadors were carrying with them a report of the riches they had seen, and that the king of Babylon and his counselors would plan to enrich their own country with the treasures of Jerusalem. Hezekiah had grievously sinned; 'therefore there was wrath upon him, and upon Judah and Jerusalem.' Verse 25.

'Then said Isaiah to Hezekiah, Hear the word of the Lord of hosts: Behold, the days come, that all that is in thine house, and that which thy fathers have laid up in store until this day, shall be carried to Babylon: nothing shall be left, saith the Lord. And of thy sons that shall issue from thee, which thou shalt beget, shall they take away; and they shall be eunuchs in the palace of the king of Babylon. {Review and Herald, May 13, 1915}

We know "All things work together for good," but we also wonder if it wouldn't have been better for Hezekiah to die. If Hezekiah had been willing to accept the will of God in laying him to rest, it might have averted the disastrous results that followed. His son Manasseh, born after this, became one of the most wicked of rulers; leading Judah into greater apostasy, which resulted in Judah being conquered, and forever losing her prestige as a nation. The fear of God was lost sight of, and many were eternally lost. It may be speculation as to how much of this evil is a direct result of Hezekiah's answered prayer, but the principal is there – should we pray for something if it may be contrary to God's will? Romans 8:26 tells us, "Likewise the Spirit also helpeth our infirmities: for we know not what we should pray for as we ought . . ."

So back to God's fourth method for dealing with sickness – God knows what is best. You see, sometimes God sees that it is the best thing for us and His cause, to die.

"There are cases where God works decidedly by His divine power in the restoration of health. But not all the sick are healed. Many are laid away to sleep in Jesus. John on the Isle of Patmos was bidden to write: 'Blessed are the dead which die in the Lord from henceforth: Yea, saith the Spirit, that they may rest from their labors; and their works do follow them.' Revelation 14:13." Ministry of Healing p. 230

In Hebrews we read of those:

# The Perfect Number

Concerning the significance of the number seven, Adam Clarke (in his "Commentary on the Bible") makes the following remarks:

The number seven is what is called among the Hebrews a number of perfection; and it is often used to denote the completion, accomplishment, fullness, or perfection of a thing, as this period contained the whole course of that time in which God created the world, and appointed the day of rest. – Comments on Ex. 29:30.

The reason for this significance is found in Genesis 2:2, where Moses says, "And on the seventh day God ended his work which he had made; and he rested on the seventh day from all his work which he had made." Genesis 2:2. The seventh day ended God's work, and became the symbol or type of the completed work; hence this significance "among the Hebrews".

The number seven, because of its being the day of the Sabbath (the day God blessed and sanctified), acquired this sacred, figurative sense: Enoch, the 'seventh from Adam,' was a type of those who will be "caught up to meet him in the air" at the second advent of our Lord; the 'clean' animals taken in sevens; the seven days Noah waited before the floods came, and the seven day intervals at which he sent out the dove; the seven fat and seven lean kine of Pharaoh's dream; the seventh month of the sacred calendar, which signified the end of the yearly service, and was a type of the plan of salvation; the seven days of unleavened bread; the seven 'sabbaths' or weeks of the feast of Pentecost; the sprinkling of the blood seven times before the veil of the sanctuary; the seven days of consecration for Aaron and his sons; the seven days of cleansing for the unclean; etc. We might give many more examples, but the foregoing are sufficient to show this use.

More notable than all, is its use in the books of prophecy (most notably those of Daniel & John) to represent the whole of some thing or period of time. In the book of Daniel we see the seven 'times' or years that were to "pass over" king Nebuchadnezzar (Daniel 4:16), at the end of

which the king was to receive both his sanity and kingdom back; the 'seventy weeks' of years which were "determined" upon Daniel's people, the end of which signified the ending "of sins," that is, of sin offerings. We also find it used many times in the book of Revelation: the seven lampstands, which are the seven churches, representing the church as a whole throughout its entire history; the seven seals, covering the progress and work of the Gospel to its end; the seven trumpets, representing the judgments and destruction of earthly kingdoms, the end of which sees "the kingdoms of this world . . . become [kingdoms] of our Lord, and of his Christ"; and finally, we see the seven last plagues, which accomplish or fill up the wrath of God upon a sinful world.

The number seven is no mystical number, neither is the Bible teaching or advocating the false concept of numerology. The types, figures, or symbols employed by God in prophecy are merely the visual agents whereby he communicates the event which is to transpire. The type or symbol employed, though figurative, derives its meaning and application from its literal application in other passages of Scripture. Thus the significance of the number seven is derived from the literal account given us in Genesis 2:1, 2. Thus it is with all the symbols employed by God in his prophecies; they are to be understood and applied according to the literal applications he himself has given throughout his word. Said the apostle Peter:

For we have not followed cunningly devised fables, when we made known unto you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, . . . We have also a more sure word of prophecy; whereunto ye do well that ye take heed, as unto a light that shineth in a dark place, until the day dawn, and the day star arise in your hearts: Knowing this first, that no prophecy of the scripture is of any private interpretation. For the prophecy came not in old time by the will of man: but holy men of God spake as they were moved by the Holy Ghost. 2 Peter 1:16-21.

And so say we. Amen.

## Pressing Reasons to Grow Your Own Food!

On an average, Americans eat several hundred calories per day more than they did 30 years ago;<sup>1</sup> and since 1994, it is approximated that an average of 40% of Americans use dietary supplements.<sup>2</sup> Despite the increase of food consumption and supplementation, mineral deficiencies in the U.S. are on the rise. In 2005 less than 60% of adult men and women in the United States met the AI [Adequate Intake] values for calcium and magnesium . . .<sup>3</sup> The Copper Association states that at least 20% of the population is copper deficient.<sup>4</sup> It is estimated that a range of 44-87% of Americans don't get enough calcium.<sup>5</sup> And we learn further from the U.S. Surgeon General that "by 2020 one in two Americans over age 50 is expected to have or to be at risk of developing osteoporosis of the hip; even more will be at risk of developing osteoporosis at any site in the skeleton."<sup>6</sup> Osteoporosis is a nutritional deficiency disease<sup>7</sup>, and if we were properly nourished, osteoporosis could be eliminated. A study funded by Merck, Sharp & Dohme shows that as many as 64% of post-menopausal women worldwide are deficient in vitamin D.<sup>8</sup>

In the U.S., our yields in food production have greatly increased through the years . . . since 1960, corn yields have more than doubled, wheat and soybean yield nearly doubled, and tomato yield nearly tripled. In the Yuma Valley of Arizona, yields of broccoli doubled in just the last two decades . . . cauliflower yields tripled over the same period. Strawberry yields . . . have jumped eightfold.<sup>9</sup> And this increase is not just in the U.S., but around the world. How paradoxical then to read that, with all this abundance of food we are still inadequately nourished?!

Malnutrition is not only an American epidemic, but a global one. Four to five billion people (66-80% of the world's population) may be iron deficient (with 2 billion of those being anemic), with hundreds of millions also suffering from health-impairing deficiencies of iodine (causing, among other things, from mild to severe mental retardation), zinc (contributing to 800,000 child deaths per year), copper, selenium and vitamin A (contributing to 500,000 children losing their sight, and 70% of those dying). The Centers for Disease Control and

Prevention published that 225,000 of the 300,000 children born with spina bifida (divided spine) and anencephaly (missing parts of the brain) each year, could be prevented by women of reproductive age increasing consumption of synthetic folate.<sup>10 11</sup> (We do not recommend this solution).

Some symptoms related to mineral deficiencies include for **magnesium**: muscle twitch, tremors, anxiety, irritability, PMS, gastro-intestinal disorders; **iron**: Anemia, constipation, brittle or spoon-shaped nails, tiredness, reduced brain function, headache; **zinc**: retarded growth, poor wound healing, poor sense of taste or smell, frequent infections, stretch marks, poor fertility; **vitamin C**: susceptibility to infections, easy bruising, bleeding or tender gums, lack of energy. We are told that copper deficiency or imbalance plays a role in the symptoms of mood disorders. Observational and experimental studies have shown an association between copper and Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD), depression, premenstrual syndrome, and schizophrenia.<sup>12</sup>



What then is the cause of our problems? If it is not the quantity of food we are eating, then it must be the quality of the food. "In 2003, News Canada reported that today's fruit and vegetables contain far fewer nutrients than they did 50 years ago. Potatoes, for example, had lost 100% of vitamin A content, 57% of vitamin C and iron, and 28% of calcium. The report examined data from the US Department of Agriculture involving vegetable quality. Over the entire 20th century the average mineral content in cabbage, lettuce, spinach and tomatoes, declined from 400mg to less than 50mg."<sup>13</sup> Data from the government of the U.S. and the U.K. have shown double digit percentage declines of zinc, selenium and other essential nutrients across a wide range of common foods.<sup>14</sup> In a study done on vegetables, comparing certain mineral levels between 1940 and 1991, there has been a decrease in sodium by 49%, Potassium by 16%, Phosphorus by 9%, Magnesium by 24%, Calcium by 46%, Iron by 27%, and an alarming 76% decrease in copper.<sup>15</sup> Similar results are seen in studies done on fruits, meat and dairy. Therefore, the same servings of food today deliver much less nutrition than what they would have 50 years ago.

Of the various agronomic practices we suspect as culprits, such as chemical fertilizers, irrigation and close plant spacing, it is our conclusion that the widespread use of pesticides and herbicides, and the genetic modification of plants are the most responsible.

The use of chemical pesticides and herbicides began as early as the 1940's, and rapidly expanded throughout world. These chemicals have been noted as a major factor in contributing to the poor nutritional quality of our produce. And though there were claims from certain seed companies that their genetically engineered crops resistant to herbicides would reduce their use, it has turned out the the opposite; for many farmers with genetically engineered crops have needed to increase their use of these chemicals.<sup>16</sup>

Glyphosate, the most widely used herbicide around the world, commonly known as Roundup, but also found under various other brand-names, has been found to cause a number of health problems: Symptoms of exposure to glyphosate include: eye irritation, burning eyes, blurred vision, skin rashes, burning or itchy

skin, nausea, sore throat, asthma and difficulty breathing, headache, lethargy, nose bleeds, and dizziness. Glyphosate and glyphosate-containing herbicides caused genetic damage in laboratory tests with human cells, as well as in tests with laboratory animals. Studies of farmers and other people exposed to glyphosate herbicides have shown that this exposure is linked with increased risks of the cancer, non-Hodgkin's lymphoma, miscarriages, and Attention Deficit Disorder (ADD). For each of the hazards identified in these studies there are laboratory studies with results which are consistent with the studies of people exposed to glyphosate. There is also laboratory evidence showing that glyphosate herbicides can reduce production of sex hormones.<sup>17</sup> Glyphosate is a known endocrine disruptor<sup>18</sup> at even ½ a part per million; especially affecting thyroid, pituitary, and reproductive functions.<sup>19</sup>

The reason that pesticides and herbicides have been found to contribute so significantly to the nutrient deficiencies in our produce is because they are metal chelators<sup>20</sup>, which inhibit the utilization of essential nutrients.<sup>21</sup> What concerns us most about Glyphosate, however, is the way it works: It is a broad spectrum herbicide, not only by specifically

inhibiting a single nutrient from being utilized by the plant, but by attaching itself to positively charged ions in general. This is alarming when you consider that all the essential minerals for plants are cations (positively charged)!<sup>22</sup>

*Dr Huber explains:* "You have to realize that this mode of action immobilizes a critical essential nutrient. Those nutrients aren't just required by the weed, but they're required by microorganisms. They're required by us for our own physiologic functions. So if it's immobilized, it may be present if we do a regular test. But it's not necessarily physiologically available *in the same efficiency that it would have been if it wasn't chelated with glyphosate . . .*"<sup>23</sup> "But it's the micronutrient that's a cation, that is, a transition element or that element that really is critical for a particular enzyme

*function.*"<sup>24</sup> Glyphosate affects about 25 different enzymes in plants, even in genetically engineered plants made to resist it. In fact GM plants are already known to be compromised in absorbing nutrients, which make them even less nutritious by the application of glyphosate. For example: "Micronutrients, such as iron, manganese, and zinc can be reduced by as much as 80-90 percent in GE plants".<sup>25</sup> "It is well documented that . . . having that foreign gene inserted reduces the capability of that plant to take up nutrients and to translocate nutrients, then, when you apply the chemical [glyphosate], you have a further compounding effect in reducing the efficiency of the plants at rates as low as 12 grams per acre."<sup>26</sup>

Some more facts about glyphosate:

- Its residue cannot be washed off, because it actually becomes part of the plant.
- 20% of it migrates from the plant's roots into the surrounding soil.
- In the soil, it affects beneficial soil microorganisms in the same way that it affects weeds: by inhibiting amino acid metabolism in what is called the shikimic acid pathway.

Furthermore, we have learned that glyphosate affects microorganisms (which are responsible for enabling plants to utilize nutrients from the soil) just as though they were weeds, which gives rise to another problem. The proper ecological balance in the soil, which is necessary for nutritious produce, is no longer available for the plant. Therefore, we cannot get the proper nutrition from these plants for the health of our bodies. Dr Huber continues: "What we see with our continued use and abuse of this powerful weed killer is that it is also totally eliminat-



*ing many of those organisms from the soil. We no longer have the same balance that we used to have. Consequently, we see an increase of over 40 new plant diseases, and diseases we used to have under fairly effective control, which now all of a sudden is another serious problem.”*

These are very serious findings! And they do not even touch on all of the areas of concern with agricultural practices. In the light of all of this, the conveniences of herbicides and pesticides, and the supposed advantages to be gained from the use of genetically modified seeds, no longer seem so convenient. And neither do the conveniences of depending upon the grocery stores for good food or upon big Agra-businesses to grow our food. In fact, they are more than just “inconvenient”, they are downright dangerous to plant, animal, and man alike.

Brethren, we have been counseled to learn about agriculture, that it should be a big part of our education and that of our children, so that we may grow our own food. There is no time to waste, let's start now.

*“Again and again the Lord has instructed that our people are to take their families away from the cities, into the country, where they can raise their own provisions; for in the future the problem of buying and selling will be a very serious one.” Adventist Home, p. 141*
